

**Storm Water Coalition Agenda**  
**Thursday, June 17, 2010**

1. Welcome and Roll.  
Introduction: Glen Tanner reminded all members that if they are not receiving emails from him to please contact him as soon as possible.
2. Update on Education Instructor/Julia Cole
  - A. Visited 88 schools out of 91 and taught 8611 students.
  - B. Coalition members passed the resolution to have new materials purchased for the next year.
  - C. Rhonda Thiele made a suggestion to give a quiz before and after each class to track the effectiveness of Julia's presentation. Members recommended presenting each teacher with a survey the teachers can use to quiz their students prior to Julia Cole's visit and again after her visit. Another suggestion was to give the teachers a survey with the teachers observations of student awareness after Julia's visit. The surveys would come to Glen Tanner, and the information would go out to each City. The survey can be used to meet State education requirements. All members agreed to keep the Storm Water Student Education program to 30 minutes for each class room visit.
3. Overview and Discussion of training
  - A. Contech training attendance was 36.  
To increase attendance at the training, each City needs to put forth greater effort to send invitations to those targeted by the training. Past experiences has shown when the Cities contact the target groups there has been greater interest.
  - B Inspector training dates on hold. The training will be held some time during the months of October or November 2010. The dates will be determined after the month of July and the training that will be held at the Fall Storm Water Expo.
  - C. Industrial training was placed on hold until after July.
  - D. A speakers list will go out to each Coalition member for the APWA training. If there are any suggestions for speakers, they are to be submitted to Glen Tanner as soon as possible. Members were encouraged to join the APWA.
4. Approval and discussion of ComplianceGo program
  - A. Coalition members felt there was need for further discussion about this online program. Specific concerns were brought up concerning the cost of the program, the storage of electronic information, and the rights to the information. A summary regarding the issues will be presented to Coalitions members and the Cities prior to a final decision to purchase the program
5. Excal training videos
  - A. Education video titles will be presented to the members during the August Storm Water meeting. These videos will be kept in the Utah County Public Works library to be checked out as needed by Coalition members.
6. Muscle Wall
  - A. The consensus was not to purchase the product at this time. The Coalition wants to see what costs would be involved if the product was to be a County/City purchase.
7. Report from sub-committees
  - A. Inspection Committee - Ryan Johnson/Orem City, Juan Garrido/Springville City, Don Overson/Vineyard City, Mark Atwood/Pleasant Grove, Scott Allen/Provo City  
The focus of the committee became education regarding pollutant of concern. permits and storm water plans, Utah Lake Commission, and the Health Department information. It became apparent that phosphorus materials need to be addressed with the general public, industries, and employees of the cities.
  - B. Education committee - Steve Johnson/Orem City, Glen Tanner/UCPW,

The committee presented ideas to increase public awareness by adding to the outreach program water fairs and student education . They suggested that the Coalition also pursue linking storm water education with the Boy Scouts of America. They also felt that the subject of the monthly flyers should be dictated by the seasons. To increase public awareness of the storm water flyer, there was a suggestion to have a product give away linked to the end of each of the flyers. A survey would be taken by the reader after which each reader could enter a monthly drawing. Items such as umbrellas, stadium seats, coolers, mood pencils, key chains, freebies, or droplets were presented as possible suggestions for give aways. There was discussion of using donated funds for storm water commercials and then ordering the DVD of those commercials to run in City buildings. There was also discussion about attaching the Storm Water information to flyers that would go out to carpet cleaning companies, tile cutters, pressure washers, oil change places, car washes, and lawn mowing companies.

Members were asked to respond back to Steve Johnson by the end of June regarding pollutants of concerns. He would like their list of pollutants and why they feel these should be address by the Coalition.
